Twister 134 Hang Glider

Flown extensively by local paraplegic Wayne Blackmore. While training in the RAAF as a pilot, Wayne was injured in a tow glider accident in 1971. Paralysed from the chest down, he later discovered hang gliding and the passion to fly.

He was a founding member of the Hang-Gliding Association of South Australia and inaugural president of the Hang-Gliding Federation of Australia. He died in July 1977, attempting a second crossing of Rapid Bay. He crashed into the sea and drowned.
