AERMACCHI MB-326H/CAC CA-30 (RAAF A7-070)

Single engine military jet trainer

History of A7-070

Aermacchi MB-326H A7-070 was built under licence by the Commonwealth Aircraft Corporation as CAC30-070, and first flew on 6 April 1970. It was delivered to the RAAF on 6 May 1970.

A7-070 served with 2FTS, and subsequently with 76SQDN.

It was transferred to RAAF School of Technical Training Wagga Wagga for use as a training aid and was painted in an overall grey scheme. The forward fuselage was then stored at RAAF Point Cook.

The forward fuselage of A7-070, including a fully equipped cockpit, was gifted by the RAAF to the South Australian Aviation Museum in June 2023. After some restoration work, the Macchi fuselage has been mounted on a frame and is displayed in Hangar 2. The frame also enables the Macchi exhibit to be taken to events such as airshows.
